PASTOR'S POINT

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

(Hebrews 10:23-25)

As we enter into the start of the summer months (how can it be June already?!?) I want to challenge all of us to be intentional on how we plan to spend our time this summer—thinking through how we can encourage one another on in the faith, and how we can continue to make meeting together for worship a priority.

As a church we've been going through the book of James. And the best-known theme found within that book is the truth that our faith and our actions are linked. You can't have faith without putting it into action. So while works cannot save you (only Jesus does that!), if we truly have Jesus in our hearts, then our lives will evidence a response that matches and backs up what it is we claim to believe. And as James proclaimed in James 2:26, faith without deeds, is dead.

So apply that, if you will, to how we worship. If worship is a central part of our lives (and as Christians who hopefully desire to follow God's instructions, it should be!), then a priority to worship should be evidenced in our actions—even during the summer.


PASTOR'S POINT CONTINUED


