But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin.1 John 1:7

As we enter March, we are just a month out from the start of Holy Week. And like this year's focal verse from 1 John 1:7, Lent gives us time to prepare and process what the passion and sacrifice of Jesus means. My hope and prayer is each time we come upon a new Lenten season, God would bring us to a place where we are drawn deeper into understanding just how much He loves us all. As we start to mature in that understanding, He draws us closer into fellowship with one another.

I don't know about you, but there are very few stories I can hear over and over again, without starting to tune out, at least to some degree. Or I begin to catch myself glossing over parts I know the best. Because one of the challenges that presents itself this time each year is we have already heard this story before. We already know the plot. We know the hero. We know the villains. We know the beginning, the middle, and even the end of the Gospel story. We have already heard the entire thing, many times over.

And yet, as we approach Easter, we need to do more than know or hear the familiar story once again. Part of this season of preparation we call Lent is being intentional about not glossing over parts or tuning out the most familiar sections of this known story. Because God doesn't just want us to hear His story. He doesn't just want you to be aware of it. No, God wants us all to experience it. We need to participate in it. Because that is what God has invited all of us to do. To not just read about it, but to live the ongoing story of God's love with his people and creation.

And that changes everything. Because the light of Jesus has come into the world in order to save us all. And if we walk in His light, together, we can celebrate our story is His story, as we live it out in real-time. The story of Jesus at Easter is an ongoing story you and I live out every day. Through you, God declares His love for the rest of creation. Through you, He delivers His message of peace and salvation for all who would believe. God's story is ongoing. And His story is delivered and lived through you. Through me. At Easter, God draws us all to Him and to each other, celebrating that through the blood of Jesus, we are purified from all sin. The real-life story that shows how in Jesus, we have eternal life. Now that's a story we can never get tired of hearing, a story we should live out every day.

Marlene Schnepel gave the treasurer's report with a balance of \$580.34.


We had two members with February birthdays: Charlene Shaw on February 7th and Marilyn Lang on February 12th. We wish them both a Happy Birthday!








MISSION BOARD
