Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire (Hebrews 12:28-29).

Worship. It involves gratitude. It involves reverence. It involves awe. Worship is the response that we (the created ones) give to our God (the creator). We approach God in worship, knowing all that we are, all that we have, all that is and will be, first and foremost comes from Him. Worship involves understanding and confessing our own brokenness.
