"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14).

As we enter into December, we are faced with the reality of the greatest gift ever given: Jesus Christ, Immanuel. Literally meaning "God with us," our Immanuel is the perfect gift and sacrifice to bring us back home to God. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, our sin and its eternal punishment is completely removed. There is a reason we set aside time where we intentionally get ready for Christmas. The gift of Jesus is of such magnitude that it cannot be taken lightly, nor should it be rushed through. So make the most of this time we've been given in Advent to prepare ourselves for the reality of the coming of Jesus, who is God with us. Let us sing praises to our God together!
